

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF SUMMIT MINING DISTRICT.
KERN COUNTY CALIFORNIA.

Meeting called by many miners pursuant to the above notice at P. D. Greenes, office Summit Depot at 10 O'Clock A. M. on October 28th. A. D. 1878, Meeting called to order by many miners and P. D. Greene elected chairman of the meeting W. J. Sullivan elected Secretary of the meeting 3d. A committee of three was appointed by the chairman for the purpose of drafting a constitution and Bye Laws for Summit Mining District.

S. F. Gates Elected Recorder.

Boundaries of the Summit Mining District.

Commencing at a point known as the "Rock Pile". one half mile North of Summit Depot and running in a direction South of South West to what is known as Merrills Marble Quarry. Thence Southerly until intercepted by the Tejon Cañon one and one half miles West of the Summit of Tejon Cañon. Thence Easterly to what is known as Sullivans Ranch on oak creek. Thence Easterly to Scovilles Station and on the Los Angeles Stage Road, Thence North-erly to the place of beginning and Rock Pile .

----Term of Office-----

There shall be a recorder elected to record locations of all mineral grounds, . The Recorder shall be elected to a term of one year and shall hold over until his successor shall be elected and the Recorder shall record all claims presented to him for record, upon the payment of his fees and at the end of his term to turn over all books and papers belonging to his office to his successor.

-----Form of Location-----

United States Mining Laws and the amendments of May 10th. 1872 adopted in full, amount of work necessary to hold a claim for one year for picking and gadding ground ten dollars ($\$10.\overset{00}{100}$) Per foot, for blasting ground twenty dollars ($\$20.\overset{00}{100}$) per foot, size of shaft a tunnel 4 x 6 feet .

Amount of fee for Recording each claim ---

The Recorder shall receive one dollar ($\$1.\overset{00}{100}$) for recording each notice of location and issuing a certificate of record, and if requested to go on the ground shall receive twenty five (25) cents per mile one way.

The amount of work done shall be judged by the Recorder or two disinterested parties, but these parties shall make an affidavit that the amount has been done and the Recorder shall issue a certificate for the same and shall receive twenty five (25) cents for each certificate .

-----Duties of the Recorder-----

What is required of the Recorder first he shall get a book to record all notices of location in, Second he shall keep said book open to public inspection .

Notices of location shall hold twenty days before required to record the same, . The Recorder shall keep a record of the proceedings of this meeting and a copy of the by laws of this, Summit Mining District in the record book of this district.

The Recorder shall receive the same fee for recording all transfers or copies of notice of location from other Mining Districts as original location.

This is to certify that the above is a true copy of the Mining laws enacted this 28th. day of October A. D. 1878. in Summit Mining District.
